You don't need to know anything about RTTY contests. We will have a couple of very, very experienced coaches here to help you. It is a 48 hour contest so everyone should be able to get some significant time in operating. Would you please pass the word to anyone you think might be interested and announce it at your club or on your two meter net, etc. It likely will be held in conjunction with a WØSD station afternoon and early evening visitation day on Saturday September 24th

If it is not and you don't have a general or higher, you can still operate some as we will have control operators. In this contest there is no need to have higher than a general class license as all the activity is in the general portion.

This is a chance to operate from a world class station who has placed

number one twice in the ARRL RTTY RU contest as well as firsts in the ARRL Sweepstakes and 10 meter contests. We have had many top 10 finishes in the 160 meter contests and other contests in which 1000's of amateurs compete.

MEMBERSHIP DUES:

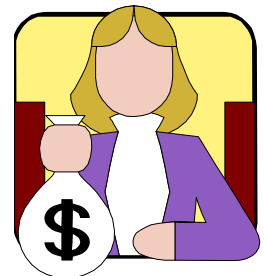
Yearly PARC Dues are \$10 for the first member of a family and \$3 each additional member if paid between Jan. 1 and March 1, 2011.
